Guidelines for Submitting AP-RASC'10 Abstract

General

All authors of both invited and contributed papers are requested to submit one-page abstracts in an electronic form via the conference website[1]. Instructions for submission are shown on the website.

The abstract must be typeset in 12pt typeface (preferably in Times Roman) and single-spaced, within a 17 cm \times 25 cm area. Page number should not be given. LaTeX[2] source file of this guideline is available at the website.

Title and Authors

Center the title of the abstract and capitalize the first letter of each word of the title. The title must be set in a bold typeface, in 14pt. Authors' names and affiliations should follow the title. The corresponding author's mailing address and e-mail address should follow. Multiple authors of different affiliations should be properly identified.

Sections

Section titles should be set in a bold typeface. Indent each paragraph. Do not leave blank lines between paragraphs.

Tables and Figures

Clear tables and figures, such as Table 1 and Figure 1, can be included in the abstract. Note that the maximum size of the file is limited to 1.0 Mbyte.

Reference List

References should be quoted by numbers, and a complete reference list should be provided at the end of the abstract. Items should be in a format as in [2, 3].
